



## My Picture, My Caption

- Remember the types of questions the class had when pictures were being shared. Take one picture at a time. First, write a caption on the picture you shared with the class. Use the information below to help.
- Before starting to write your captions, consider the following questions:
  - What is the most important thing about your picture?
  - Where was it taken?
  - Who or what is in the picture?
  - When was the picture taken, and is that important information for people looking at it to know? How old were you? Is that important?
  - What time of the year was it? Can you tell that already from the picture?
- Photo captions are usually short—only one or two sentences. Your challenge is to give people enough information to understand the picture in very few words. So, give them only the important facts. Don't give them obvious facts, such as telling them it is winter when the picture already shows snow on the ground.
